At Uthando, we are dedicated to supporting a range of youth development projects that offer children the chance to engage in activities such as dancing, singing, playing musical instruments, and participating in sports. #### TABLE TENNIS FOR PHILISA ABAFAZI BETHU (HEAL OUR WOMEN)



In September 2023, Uthando responded to their urgent call for assistance by providing relief to 1,000 individuals through their dedicated network. Our support helped deliver crucial aid during a time of need, reinforcing our commitment to community welfare and the impactful work of Ladles of Love. Below was the call for assistance.

"One week ago, the Western Cape was filled with excitement for the Heritage Day long weekend. But the weather warnings turned our anticipation into concern. The relentless storm left a devastating impact, particularly in the Overberg area.

Our Ladles of Love community, fuelled by compassion and kindness, swiftly responded to the crisis. Our Women Warriors and our team in Hermanus, led by Hilary and Bernard Stern, rallied local support to aid flood victims.

However, we face a humanitarian crisis exacerbated by soaring food prices. To provide food relief, we urgently need funds to purchase over 20 tons of essential groceries, including rice, samp, and potatoes. Clothing and blankets are also in high demand.

We desperately need funds to buy fresh produce and staple foods to feed vulnerable people left destitute and displaced from storms and floods in the Western Cape. For every R1,000, we can feed 200 people via our network of community soup kitchens.

This is a time for drastic action and unwavering compassion. The sun may be shining, but the crisis continues. With your support, we can make a difference."

## FEED THE KALTHSA URBAN MICRO FARM – A LOVELY STORY OF RESPONSIBLE TOURISM IN ACTION

In early 2022, Uthando connected with Feed the Kaltsha, a micro farm in Khayelitsha started by five young men during the Covid-19 crisis. The farm, initially supporting a local center, expanded to sell produce and receive support from Timeless Africa Safaris. A Canadian family's visit in July 2023 highlighted the farm's impact, leading to a generous donation that was reinvested into the garden. This reflects the powerful role of tourism in fostering community growth and grassroots change.

I hope this letter finds you well.

Firstly, we would like to thank and appreciate your generosity and kindness.

Your donation to Feed The Khaltsha has been helpful. We have managed to purchase uniforms for our staff members, which best accommodates winter. It's always a pleasure knowing that everyone is kept healthy and warm when working. This makes us even more productive and motivates us to work even more harder.

It's been hard for the past few months during heavy rains, working wasn't easy as we work in a garden, so as much as we need rain for our crops, too much rain can be a setback for us. Even worse, not being able to consistently work when its pouring was a major issue, but now that we have our uniforms, we'll be able to improvise and be productive.

We also got labels so that we can keep record of where a certain crop has been planted. It is good to label your beds especially when they are in seed stage. It gets hard to identify where you planted your seeds when your yield is big. It is also going to help us identify which tourist came and helped us plant on that certain day. We are also going to label their names and send them pictures when the harvest is ready. We also added more stationary to help us keep track of our records.

This will help our brand by showing that we are united and were a team. At Feed The Khaltsha we believe nothing beats working together, not just as a team but working together as the "Khaltsha" (community). These uniforms are a symbol of unity. Our Vision is to unite everyone, feed the Khaltsha (community) and create jobs.

"This is an unbelievable story of hardship, perseverance and hope. The Eyes2Eyes Foundation is overwhelmed with gratitude for the support received from uThando and We Are Africa in helping us restore Likho's sight!

Likho lives in rural Eastern Cape, with his grandmother. He started losing his sight five years ago, due to keratoconus. This is an eye disease that has caused his corneas to progressively bulge and thin, resulting in severe vision loss. His eye sight cannot be remedied with ordinary glasses or contact lenses. Living with progressive sight loss has presented this young man with extraordinary challenges.

Not only has finishing school been immensely challenging, but Likho's mom had to make the heartbreaking decision to send him to live with his grandmother, far from Cape Town. She simply could not give him the day to day assistance he required as she struggled to survive economically and support her young family in Crossroads.

Whilst Likho's friends have done their best to help him with his homework, he has really struggled to keep up with his grades. Aged 21, he has never given up and remains determined to finish Grade 12. He is terribly excited that soon he will also be able to re-join his friends on the soccer pitch! Not being able to engage with a sport he loves, has been another big obstacle during a trying time.

We are over the moon that Likho will start his journey to sight restoration in June and simply could not have done this without your generosity and kindness.

# **PROJECTS**

#### LEARN TO EARN

Learn to Earn plays a crucial role in equipping South Africans with essential skills for a brighter future. They offer training and skills development in various fields, including baking, basic computer skills, handyman services, office administration, graphic design, barista training, sewing, and life skills.

During the 2022 financial year, they welcomed 635 registrations across their courses, with an impressive 600 participants completing their training at their campuses in Khayelitsha, Hermanus, and the Ground UP Barista Academy. This reflects a remarkable 94% completion rate. Following their training, 76% of graduates became economically active or continued their studies, with 92% of those employed sustaining their positions for at least three months. Notably, 26% of graduates have started their own businesses.

Before joining Learn to Earn, the average declared monthly income was R539 per person. After completing their course, graduates who secured employment reported an average monthly income of R4,400 after three months, totaling at least R4.8 million in combined quarterly earnings. This transformation highlights the significant impact of their training interventions on individuals and their communities.




